Seasonal Workforce Housing Thursday, October 26th 6:30 – 8:00 PM

This 90-minute webinar will define and summarize workforce housing and related trends nationally and in Michigan, review zoning and other policy tools that communities can use to meet their workforce housing goals and provide examples on how several Michigan communities are meeting their seasonal and year-round workforce housing needs.

This 90-minute webinar will begin by exploring trends and research related to STRs as well as where local communities can find data to examine their own local situation. The program will highlight several Michigan examples of community regulatory approaches to STRs.
