# <u>Designated Planning Agency Report</u> May 29, 2025

A report of materials management planning actions from April 17-May 29, 2025:

I have received confirmations from Counties and EGLE that MMP Grant Agreements have been sent out and are beginning to be executed. As of this meeting, Alger and Menominee County have executed grant agreements and have received information about how to access their grant funding. The counties are able to reimburse for funding related to the work program going back to January of 2024. Starting in the Fall, we will work on how to communicate and create the work program budgets for the next year. Implementation activities will be coordinated by this Committee with the respective County Board of Commissioners, and any approval for use of funding goes through the County MMP Grant Manager.

I had the opportunity to follow up with Tracy Tomaszewski, our EGLE Recycling Specialist, a few times over the past month on various opportunities and at the Michigan Recycling Coalition Conference. The MRC held a statewide DPA workgroup meeting on April 21 with a presentation by Kent County Department of Public Works for discussion of their various facilities, programs, and flow control funding mechanisms. A meeting later in the week with Michigan Association of Regions DPA workgroup highlighted the slow startup of some of the other committees more dependent on the availability of the grant funding. From speaking with other groups and DPAs at the MRC Conference, I believe that the Central Region may be some months ahead of others in Plan development. With that, we are sharing heavily with the Western and Eastern UP to provide some efficiency and alignment between our 3 UP Plans.

CUPPAD was presented with the opportunity to receive an intern for 8 weeks from Yale University. Axel Vermaat is Kathy's son, and jumped headlong into materials management in the first week of May. Axel is focusing on developing recycling outreach, education, and marketing best practices that we can translate into implementation at the county-by-county level. Axel and I meet throughout the week to keep track of what he's working on, and ultimately he will develop a presentation of his findings for the Committee's July meeting. The goal is to use the work that is developed to jumpstart our conversations on goal scoping and implementation actions.

I attended the Michigan Recycling Coalition's annual conference in Muskegon May 13-15 and had plenty of opportunities to speak with Committee members, DPAs, industry partners, and other stakeholders throughout the event. I helped lead the Regional Outreach meeting in partnership with the Norther Lower Peninsula, where attendees discussed shared issues and opportunities with materials management planning, rural community issues and program development, and organics. I came away with a number of good questions and potential ideas to work into the Plan development process and for the involvement of the Committee. The Keynote speaker on Thursday was a municipal attorney who reviewed Part 115 in detail, and offered many suggestions for how to keep Plan implementation active and supported once the initial Plan is approved.

Current Plan development work continues to focus on data discovery and collating various materials and ideas for Committee review and recommendations. The tentative topic for June is exploring the inventory of how materials management is being implemented locally through various mechanisms. Following Axel's presentation at the July meeting, we will shift more into the goal development and implementation objectives phase of planning.

Lastly, I would like to highlight awards from the NextCycle Michigan technical assistance program to Delta County Solid Waste Management Authority supporting additional collection and processing capacity for recyclables and Manistique High School supporting capacity building and infrastructure for initiating recycling in Schoolcraft County, and to Partridge Creek Compost from the Marquette County Community Foundation to support development of organics drop-off sites within the county. Partridge Creek Compost was also featured on the May 22 edition of Upper Michigan Today on TV6. Also of note is the award to Marquette County Solid Waste Management Authority of "exceptional status" in Excellence in Environmental and Public Health Protection from the EPA for their landfill leachate wastewater treatment operations.
